Grandview Children's Foundation Sample Bequest Wording

Suggested will clause wording for an unrestricted use legacy:

“My estate trustees shall pay the sum of _____ dollars to Grandview Children's Foundation to be used for its general purposes as Grandview Children's Foundation sees fit. The receipt of the person who professes to be the proper person to give a receipt on behalf of the said Foundation shall be a sufficient discharge to my estate trustees for the amount paid.”

Suggested will clause wording for unrestricted use gift of residue:

“My estate trustees shall pay the sum of _____ (OR ____% of the residue) of my estate to Grandview Children's Foundation to be used for its general purposes as Grandview Children's Foundation sees fit. The receipt of the person who professes to be the proper person to give a receipt on behalf of the said Foundation shall be a sufficient discharge to my estate trustees for the amount paid.”

Suggested will clause wording for a restricted use legacy:

“My estate trustees shall pay the sum of _____ dollars to Grandview Children's Foundation to be used for _____. If unforeseen circumstances make the specified use of this gift no longer practical or desirable as determined by the Board of Directors of Grandview Children's Foundation, the Board of Directors of Grandview Children's Foundation may change the terms of the specified use, such change to be in keeping as far as possible with the general intent of this gift and notification thereof shall be provided by the Foundation to the individual or formal body representing the original donor. The receipt of the person who professes to be the proper person to give a receipt on behalf of the said Foundation shall be a sufficient discharge to my estate trustees for the amount paid.”

Suggested will clause wording for restricted use of a residuary gift:

“My estate trustees shall pay the sum of _____ (OR ____% of the residue) of my estate to Grandview Children's Foundation, to be used for _____. If unforeseen circumstances make the specified use of this gift no longer practical or desirable, as determined by the Board of Directors of Grandview Children's Foundation, the Board of Directors of Grandview Children's Foundation may change the terms of the specified use, such change to be in keeping as far as the Board of the Foundation deems possible with the general intent of this gift and notification thereof shall be provided by the Foundation to the individual or formal body representing the original donor of this gift. The receipt of the person who professes to be the proper person to give a receipt on behalf of the said Foundation shall be a sufficient discharge to my estate trustees for the amount paid.”
